Brief Description of the activity	Overview of Sahyadri Farms Ketchup Manufacturing Facility Sahyadri Farms is renowned for processing and manufacturing a wide range of food products, with a significant focus on tomato-based products like ketchup. The facility includes sections for raw material storage, washing, sorting, grinding, cooking, bottling, and packaging. During the visit, we observed how the facility operates with an emphasis on maintaining high standards of efficiency, safety, and quality. Experiment 1: Study of Workshop Layout During our visit, we focused on analysing the layout of the ketchup manufacturing unit, which is designed to ensure smooth workflow and efficient production. The layout included: • Raw Material Section: Storage and sorting of tomatoes, ensuring easy access for further processing. • Processing Area: Placement of grinding and cooking machinery in a manner that optimizes workflow, with close proximity to storage and washing areas. • Bottling and Packaging: Located towards the end of the line, ensuring a seamless transition from cooked product to packaging. • Quality Control Section: A dedicated area to ensure that the product meets quality standards before packaging. Experiment 2: Study of Workshop Safety The visit also provided an opportunity to understand the safety measures implemented within the facility, which are crucial in food processing environments. The following safety aspects were observed: • Hazard Identification: Areas with potential risks, such as high-temperature cooking and automated machinery, were well-marked with warning signs. • Safety Guidelines: Workers were equipped with Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) like gloves, masks, and hairnets to maintain both personal safety and product hygiene. • Emergency Equipment: Fire extinguishers, first aid kits, and emergency stop buttons were placed strategically across the workshop for quick access in case of an emergency. Conclusion The industrial visit to Sahyadri Farms provided valuable practical exposure to the students, bridging the gap between theoretical knowledge and real-world applications. It enabled us to directly observe how a well-planned workshop layout and stringent safety measures are critical to the smooth functioning of an industrial setup.
